  - -School Ties focuses on issues of Anti-semitism in a historical context.
  - -Remember the Titans tells the story of a football coach who uses sports to help his players work through racial conflicts.
  - -North Country is based upon a true story relevant to the first class action sexual harassment law suit in US history.
  - -Crash is a very powerful movie dealing with diversity issues in a very real manner.
- Read a book or have a discussion with a group of children that addresses the Thanksgiving holiday through the eyes of different ethnic groups.
  - -Duck for Turkey Day by Jacqueline Jules is a sweet story about Tuyet, a Vietnamese-American girl, who is upset that her family isn't celebrating Thanksgiving like all of her friends.

-Tikvah Means Hope by Patricia Polloco starts off giving a somewhat standard "neighbourhood multicultural" exposure, with Mr. Roth building a Sukkath to celebrate Sukkoth, the Jewish festival of Thanksgiving. However, the book quickly takes a turn that shows readers how much we truly have to be grateful for.

- Play cultural music from different ethnic groups or have local cultural/ heritage musical groups perform live for a special event.
  - -there is a broad range of musical genres; which include blues, gospel, traditional country, zydeco, and tejano. Gather local musicians of various cultures for an evening of music!
